Missed shots by Paige in game 2 continued to keep Walter on the table and in control of the game. He closed out game 2 and then continued to dominate in game 3 putting together another long run including a bank

shot to maintain table control. A couple of missed shots by Walter gave Paige an open shot and she put together a four ball finish to take game 4. Game 5 was all Walter again as he kept Paige from getting anything easy to start. He finished the game with some very nice shot making and position play. Game 6 went back and forth

with some key shot making by both players. Walter got decent leave with three of his group remaining and he promptly finished off the game, taking a 5-1 lead in the match. Walter continued where he left



off in the first set to start the <u>9 Ball Set</u> posting the opening win in the set. He continued to get great starting shots and ran off the final five balls in game 2.

from getting anything easy in the first game of the <u>9</u>


